A group of local artists with the colourful name *Kaleidoscope: East Humber Artists* will present a watercolour show at Daniel's of Nobleton this summer from June 1<sup>st</sup> through August 31<sup>st</sup>.

To celebrate both the palate and the palette, Daniel Gilbert, owner and chef extraordinaire of Daniel's of Nobleton will host a Meet-the-Artists dinner on Sunday, June 3<sup>rd</sup> from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. Daniel will prepare a special prix fixe menu as well as offer his new June fare for the occasion. Two years ago, members of the Botanical Artists of Canada, Carole Ahmad, Fran Andreana, Donna Greenstein, Ann Love, Margit Sampogna and Karen Taylor realized they were neighbours and decided to paint together to critique and support each other's work. Although members of *Kaleidoscope* also paint landscapes, street scenes, portraits and florals, their underlying connection is scientifically accurate, botanical watercolours of the plants –

flowers, fruits and vegetables – growing in the gardens, meadows, roadsides, hedgerows and forests of the East Humber watershed.



Individual members of Kaleidoscope have shown before – at Canada Blooms (Toronto), Studio Tour (King), the Town Hall (Aurora), Peel Heritage Gallery (Brampton), Aird Gallery (Toronto), Kingcrafts (King), Elizabeth Legge Gallery (Yorkville), Heschel Arts Festival (Thornhill), Bindertwine Festival (Kleinburg), Neilson Park Exhibition (Etobicoke), Festival of the Arts (Aurora), Feast of the Palate (Caledon) – but this is their first exhibition as a group. Members of *Kaleidoscope* will also contribute to the Arts Society of King Studio Tour in the Schomberg Public Library July 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2007, and to a special Botanical Artists of Canada exhibition at Todmorden Mills, Toronto, October 4<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup>, 2007. *Kaleidoscope* is planning a group exhibit at the King Museum in the spring of 2008 to celebrate the tenth anniversary of the designation of the Humber River as a World Heritage River by the United Nations.
